CAMPAIGN UPDATES

Winter/Meet the Experts

- A robust winter communications plan is being implemented for NHS Lanarkshire encompassing media, social media, web pages, video, radio advertising and staff communications.
- A joint West of Scotland "Winter/NHS expert" radio campaign, led by NHS Lanarkshire, launched on 7 January. It is being broadcast on Clyde 1, Clyde 2, Westsound, West FM, Central, Heart and Smooth during January and February.
- The west of Scotland Mental Health Meet the Expert video launched on social media on Friday 21 December.
- Our Emergency departments were reported to be busy on 7 and 8 January. We issued a
 video of Frances Dodd, Acute Divisional Nurse Director, urging people to use alternative
 health experts and services as opposed to A&E. At 11 January the video had more than
 28,000 views on Facebook.
- In advance of the festive season, a video was issued from the pharmacy team encouraging the public to bring their regular medications with them when they come to hospital. at 11 January, this video has been viewed more than 10,000 times on Facebook.
- To honour NHS staff who work on Christmas Day, a music video featuring maternity staff was filmed and promoted. This video has had more than 660,000 views on Facebook, by far the most views of any NHS Lanarkshire video.
- We have issued several internal winter preparedness messages to staff via, The Pulse. Staff Briefing and 'all in Lanarkshire' emails.

Flu

- NHS Lanarkshire is running a campaign to encourage uptake of the flu jab by staff.
- January has seen further messages encouraging staff to get their flu jab to protect their patients from increasing flu cases in the community.
- Roving immunisation teams have been active throughout NHS Lanarkshire, which will be
 publicised by the Communications Team via emails, staff briefing, Pulse Online and FirstPort
 (intranet) banners.

Breastfeeding


- Work is continuing to finalise a suite of six animations.
- The animations bust the common myths around breastfeeding in a bid to encourage breastfeeding mothers to breastfeed for longer.
- The animations focus on the following themes: being out and about; sleeping; having enough milk; illness; frequency of feeding; and what the family can do to help.
- Scoping work is underway into how we can engagement with people in Lanarkshire to have an "honest conversation" about breastfeeding.

Violence and aggression

 A joint campaign is being developed with Police Scotland aimed at reducing violence and aggression against NHS Lanarkshire staff.

MEDIA MONITORING

All media articles mentioning NHS Lanarkshire are assigned a score on the basis of publication, prominence and tone (very positive, positive, neutral, negative, very negative) against set criteria. This is used to calculate an overall value of coverage score for each week. The graph below shows the weekly overall value of media coverage from November 2017 to December 2018.


