3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

Yvonne Robson was an inpatient in Ward 20 in Hairmyres Hospital from 9 October 2014 until 26 November 2014, and from 23 December 2014 until her death on 23 May 2015. Her diagnosis was of severe depression in the context of a 25+ year history of bipolar affective disorder. At the time of her death she was on an extended weekend pass from hospital which had been pre-arranged as part of a discharge plan.

On 24 May 2015 the ward was contacted by the Police reporting that they had found a body, which was later identified as Yvonne.

Following Yvonne's death, in line with NHS Lanarkshire protocol, a Significant Adverse Event Review (SAER) was undertaken, and an Action Plan compiled. The outstanding action within the Plan was to provide an opportunity for the family to meet with the Board to present their experience, and this has been arranged in collaboration with the family for the March 2019 Board meeting.

Yvonne's brother Damian, and sister, Karen, will address the Board, and will be supported in their presentation by their brother Brian and sister Elaine.
