CAMPAIGN UPDATES

Breastfeeding

- Work is continuing to finalise a suite of six animations with a view to launching in June during Breastfeeding Awareness Week
- The animations address the common myths around breastfeeding in a bid to encourage breastfeeding mothers to breastfeed for longer.
- The animations focus on the following themes: being out and about; sleeping; having enough milk; illness; frequency of feeding; and what the family can do to help.

Infection Prevention and Control:

A communications plan for 2019/20 has been agreed with the Infection Prevention and Control team. The plan was shared and discussed at the Public Reference Forum (PRF) and it was agreed that the two public messages be included in the plan, namely:

- Improve hand decontamination carried out by the public specially when visiting patients in hospital
- Strengthen the message to the public when visiting the hospital to stay avoid visiting
 when unwell e.g. with symptoms of loose stools, vomiting and flu like illness such as
 coughs, sneezes and fever.

To address this, the four actions below have been agreed.


- 1. Re-make the winter season video to advise members of the public not to visit if unwell.
- 2. Share information with the PRF for onward distribution to the various groups/agencies.
- 3. Provide a poster or label on the alcohol based hand rub dispenser(s) at the entrance to the ward/department to remind visitors as well as staff to decontaminate their hands.
- 4. Include some of the public reference forum staff in the winter road shows to enhance the message to the public.

Violence and aggression

- A campaign is currently being developed which aims to reduce violence and aggression against NHS Lanarkshire staff.
- Research work has taken place to ensure that the campaign will target the correct audience in the most effective way.

MEDIA MONITORING

All media articles mentioning NHS Lanarkshire are assigned a score on the basis of publication, prominence and tone (very positive, positive, neutral, negative, very negative) against set criteria. This is used to calculate an overall value of coverage score for each week. The graph below shows the weekly overall value of media coverage from March to April 2019.



Content continues to build on the site which has been structured around mobile phone and tablet access, rather than desktop, since most people now access the web using these devices. The site has been designed for easy navigation, with drop down boxes of information making pages clearer and reducing the overall number.

User-testing, staff training and governance procedures are the focus for the next phase.

Audience Overview May 2018 - April 2019




