#### 5. MEASURES FOR IMPROVEMENT

Monitoring of performance against the plans in place will provide valuable information to inform future planning cycles.

#### 6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Thus far, £579,903 has been made available from Scottish Government together with £1,590,000 set aside by NHSL/H&SCPs (comprising £500,000 Acute/NHSL, £387,000 South IJB Reserves, £403,000 North IJB reserves and £300k across Primary care/hosted services).

This provides an overall sum of £2,169,903 to meet the overall range of mitigating measures planned to assist in managing the pressures of the winter period 2019/20.

Plans are currently exceeding this amount and work is ongoing in prioritising the current requests for funding as well as potentially identifying alternative funding sources.

# 7. RISK ASSESSMENT/MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

Filling of staffing rotas over the peak winter period has been identified as a risk however work is ongoing in filling the respective rotas.

Risk assessments have also been undertaken across each of the main areas as per the winter planning matrix.

Winter planning testing is also going to be undertaken in a number of ways as described in the attached report.
