## 3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

A key objective in the establishment of the Oversight Board was to improve the level of transparency and local engagement with the planning for a replacement for University Hospital Monklands (UHM). To that end the Lanarkshire NHS Board has appointed six independent members to MROB: two senior clinicians, and two members from both the North and South Lanarkshire Patient Public Forums (PPFs).

However, MROB recognised at its initial meeting in October that the localities of Coatbridge and Airdrie were not directly represented on MROB due to the cessation of locality PPFs in those areas. Coatbridge and Airdrie residents are, of course, high users of UHM and the absence of voices from these localities may reduce the effectiveness of the MROB moving forwards through the project.

To that end, North PPF and the community councils in the Airdrie and Coatbridge areas have been re-engaged by the NHSL Planning and Communications teams to seek nominations for membership of MROB. This included a meeting of community councillors in UHM in early December and discussion by the Director of Planning, Property & Performance with interested individuals.

This meeting led to the nomination by the collective community councils of Mr O'Hara and Ms Craig to join MROB. Ms Mullen has been nominated by the chair, Bellshill Community Forum and supported by the North PPF members of MROB.

In conclusion, this engagement process has resulted in the nomination of these three individuals to join MROB:

Richard O'Hara, Kirkwood Community Council (Coatbridge)
Sharon Craig, North Calder Community Council (Airdrie)
Theresa Mullen, member of North Lanarkshire Residents & Tenants Association and of the former Coatbridge Community Forum (resident of Coatbridge)

MROB endorsed these nominations for approval by the Lanarkshire NHS Board
