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SUBJECT: MONKLNDS REPLACMENT PROJECT - SITE SELECTION PROCESS AND ASSESSMENT OF ALTERNATIVE SITE LOCATIONS

1. PURPOSE

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2. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

Members of the public have been asked to nominate potential viable sites for consideration to ensure that all available sites could be fully assessed. A total of eight additional sites were nominated by this route and have now been assessed against the agreed selection criteria.

The agreed selection criteria are:

- 1. Must sit within the University Hospital Monklands unscheduled care catchment area.
- 2. Must be a minimum of 40 developable acres.
- 3. Must have no detrimental impact on adjoining unscheduled catchment areas of hospitals in Lanarkshire, Glasgow or Forth Valley.
- 4. Must be designated by NLC to permit appropriate development.
- 5. Must have sufficient road and transport infrastructure to support the development of a major hospital site.

Two appendices are attached which describe, respectively, the analysis of sites against criterion 3, and the overall site selection and shortlisting process against all 5 criteria.

The conclusion from this assessment is that one additional site, site 53 (Farm Land at Wester Moffat), meets all of the selection criteria and should be added to the shortlist of sites for further consideration.

Site 44 (Farm Land at Bargeddie) was assessed as being suitable to be added to the shortlist following nomination by NLC in September. Subsequent discussions with the owners of site 44 (Farm Land at Bargeddie) have concluded that that the land being made available for sale does not meets criterion 2 as the total available land is less than 40 acres. The site should therefore be withdrawn from the proposed of sites for further consideration.

MROB meeting on the 6th January 2020 recommended that the final shortlist for further evaluation is:

- Site 1 Drumshangie (Glenmavis)
- Site 12 Gartcosh
- Site 53 Farm Land, Wester Moffat
