by the Monklands Replacement Oversight Board (MROB) meeting on 6th January 2020.

3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

NHS Lanarkshire has appointed the Consultation Institute (CI) as independent engagement advisors for the Monklands Replacement Project (MRP). The CI is a well-established not-for-profit best practice institute, promoting high-quality public and stakeholder consultation in the public, private and voluntary sectors. The institute has advised on high-profile consultation and engagement exercises in the NHS and other sectors across the UK.

With advice from the CI, NHS Lanarkshire developed a draft communication and engagement plan, with indicative timescales, which was endorsed by the Monklands Replacement Oversight Board at its meetings on 28th October 2019 and with amendment at MROB on 6th January 2020.

A detailed plan which includes specific dates for communications and engagement activities has since been developed. A copy of it is attached to this paper (Appendix 3) along with a separate spreadsheet (Appendix 4) showing the overall timetable for MRP engagement and option reevaluation.

The communication and engagement plan includes the following key activities:

- An invitation to the public to nominate further potential hospital locations that had not already been considered, taking into account the agreed site selection criteria. This process took place between October 31 and December 13 2019.
- Publication of a site shortlist, developed following analysis of both public site suggestions
 and any potential locations identified though a new site search by North Lanarkshire
 Council.

- Publication of detailed, validated information on all shortlisted sites. This consistent data set for each site will ensure that full and accurate information on each site is readily available for review by members of the public. This part of the process will be supported by a range of communication and engagement activities including press releases and social media, information on the dedicated MRP webpage, information stalls, communication with staff, and the opportunity to seek clarification on any aspect of the process or any of the detailed information provided in respect of the shortlisted sites.
- An opportunity for the public and community groups to nominate potential participants in the formal scoring event. The process for nominating and selecting representatives who will participate will be overseen by the Consultation Institute, to ensure objectivity. A total of 51 of the 100 scoring event participants will be drawn from those members of the public who have been nominated. Please refer to Appendix 1, which describes in more detail the process to be used, and how the final participants will be selected. Please note the caveat that this process may require review should the numbers of nominees not be sufficient, and/or the mix of participants described be unachievable.
- An opportunity for the public to submit their suggestions for the evaluation criteria which will be used at the formal scoring event, to establish the individual criteria and their relative weighting. Please refer to Appendix 2, which describes in more detail the process to be used.
- Commissioning of representative survey(s) during engagement to gather a balance of opinion across the general populous.
- Use of People's Hearings, two independently-chaired events where a panel will hear representations from members of the public or organised groups, who wish to put forward any concerns they have about the accuracy or legitimacy of any information issued by NHS Lanarkshire regarding the shortlisted sites.
- A formal scoring event which will be facilitated by an independent engagement organisation to ensure objectivity. Pre-briefing sessions will be held for all participants.
- Engagement feedback to be collated for consideration by participants during the site reevaluation exercise

NHS Lanarkshire is working closely with the Scottish Health Council (SHC), which will have a quality assurance role in relation to the engagement activities undertaken. Meetings have taken place between NHS Lanarkshire, SHC and CI in order to ensure a consistent approach to engagement that is endorsed by all organisations.

The MRP Stakeholder Engagement Group (SEG), continues to provide input into the communications and engagement activities. The SEG includes public stakeholder representatives, whose number has been strengthened through the recent appointment of four additional members, representing the Airdrie and Coatbridge areas.

Board members were provided with a detailed presentation of the risks being managed on the Monklands site at the Planning, Performance and Resources Committee meeting held on 11 April 2019.
