SUBJECT: CONTRACT FOR PRINCIPAL SUPPLY CHAIN PARTNER, LANARKSHIRE PROJECTS 2021 – 2026

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this paper is to seek Board Members approval to award the Principal Supply Chain Partner, Lanarkshire Projects 2021 – 2026 contract to John Graham Construction Ltd following a tender exercise.

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2. ROUTE TO THE BOARD

This paper has been prepared by Chris Sanderson, General Manager, Procurement, and was endorsed by the Corporate Management Team on 22 March 2021.

3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

Background

In 2014 NHS Lanarkshire (NHSL) entered a contract with John Graham Construction Ltd to act as construction Principal Supply Chain Partner (PSCP) for Monklands and Lanarkshire-wide business continuity programmes, as well other service development projects. The contract resulted from a tender process within the Health Facilities Scotland (HFS) Frameworks 2 (FS2) and is due to expire on 31st March 2021.

When the new HFS Frameworks 3 PSCP framework went live recently, a similar tender process to appoint a PSCP for a new contract term commenced with the issue of tender documents via the Public Contracts Scotland portal in January 2021. The estimated value of the future programme is around $\pounds 40$ million over a period of five years, but NHS Lanarkshire will not be bound to any level of expenditure under the contract.

Tender Evaluation

Four tenders were received from Balfour Beatty, Graham Construction, Keir Construction, and McLaughlin & Harvey. The evaluation panel consisted of a cross-section of NHS Lanarkshire staff from Property & Support Services Division, Planning & Development, Finance and Procurement. The Board were also assisted and advised throughout the process by an appointed officer from the HFS Frameworks 3 team and lead advisors, Aecom.

Tender evaluation was based upon determination of the most economically advantageous tender through price and quality factors, with the weightings attached to each 40% and 60% respectively.

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The combined scoring resulting from the tender process is shown below. All tenderers receive a 'standstill letter' with their score and the winning tenderers score with feedback. The contract award (if approved by Board) will also result in the publication of a contract award notice which will be in the public domain. To protect unsuccessful bidders' anonymity, the individual scores have been anonymised in the table below:
