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The Board is asked to consider for approval the final draft of our new healthcare strategy Our Health Together.

2. ROUTE TO THE NHS BOARD

The draft strategy has been considered for comment by the Strategic Delivery Team, Area Partnership Forum, Area Clinical Forum, Public Reference Forum and the Planning, Performance and Resources Committee.

The route to the Board has also included engagement with the Non-Executive Directors at a NXD briefing session.

3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

Our Health together (OHT) sets out the Board's strategy for the period dating from 2024 to 2031. The strategy was developed following an extensive stakeholder engagement programme that ran from April to August 2023 and involved patients, carers, our staff and local communities, including children and young people.

OHT provides the overarching strategic direction and is aligned to the Transformation and Reform programme that is already underway. The strategy also reflects both local and national priorities. The four reform groups referenced as the priority areas of focus within the document will become the delivery arm of Our Health Together going forward. These groups will develop implementation plans for the short to medium term and will continue to engage and involve key stakeholders in their work.

The new NHS Lanarkshire 'Vision' has yet to be signed off and will be incorporated into the final OHT document prior to publication.

The Board is asked to approve the final draft OHT strategy which is attached as Appendix 1.
