The Bellshill Health Improvement Team provided capacity support to a number of priority groups to access funding to deliver and expand their current activities.

£33,000

'The Well Foundation' (based at Lanarkshire Mosque) Received £33k to deliver sporting activities for ethnic minority communities across North Lanarkshire (original application was £16k but was so well received it was increased to £33k to expand the project wider) Starting in 2023, the programme will open up sports including; football, netball, multi sports and yoga to the minority ethnic population, who have additional barriers to accessing physical activity opportunities.

> Bowel Screening

Neighbourhood Networks & NLC Supported Employment

Bowel screening awareness sessions were delivered to organisations who support adults with a learning disability, to engage in their communities and move into employment. Adults with a Learning Disability are less likely to take up their bowel screening invite and understanding the instructions were a major barrier to uptake. Working with National Screening Services, we received additional bowel screening kits to demonstrate how to use the

Community Planning / LOIP

Once again the Bellshill Community and partnership organisations triumphed at Christmas. In year 2 of our collaborative approach we asked referrers, where possible, to provide the postcode of the child and family they were referring for support. From 711 referrals, partner organisations were able to provide the full post code for 204 children referred.







The 9 Christmas Steering Group organisations agreed that being unable to provide a post code would not be a barrier to supporting our families The reasons why a post code could not be provided included;

- Child Protection
- Care Experienced Young People moving around
- People experiencing / fleeing domestic abuse
