
## Blood Borne Virus & Sexual Health Team Flash Report 2022/2023

The Blood Borne Virus and Sexual Health (BBV&SH) Promotion Team deliver prevention activities, services and education programmes to: reduce inequalities, support delivery of national frameworks and strategies and in response to local need

174,806 Condoms Total

### **Condom Distribution Schemes**

This year, a total of 174,806 condoms have been distributed across the various strands of the Condom Distribution Schemes. This is an increase on the last 2 year totals.



There are **115** C Card Centres, based within Health Centres/Pharmacies, where anyone who lives, works or studies in Lanarkshire can access free condoms. The Just Ask Service has grown to 90 members, with 16 new services recruited this year, including services supporting young people, refugees and people experiencing homelessness.

reduction in young males accessing sexual health services.



## 2905 packs of 12 postal



Using postcodes, it is possible to capture the distribution of the 2,009 Condoms by Post requests, by Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD). The majority of requests are made from the most deprived areas in SIMD 1-3, consistent

## mpox

## hasn't gone away.

From May 2022, public health agencies in the UK have been responding to an outbreak of mpox (previously known as monkeypox). The team supported work of the Lanarkshire Incident Management Team (IMT), leading on communications on the website and supplying condoms and information to vaccination clinics for individuals identified as most at risk.

The team, along with colleagues in Glasgow and Lothian, launched a consent resource in June 2022 called, Awkward Moments. Young people were meaningfully involved in every aspect of the campaign and outputs include 5 short films, addressing a variety of themes and situations: https://www.awkwardmoments.co.uk/

The team will continue to offer a wide range of training provision and plans are in place to progress the HMP Shotts Health Improvement Strategy Group action plan, with a particular focus on the BBV prevention section as a priority. Local priorities will also be established based on the detail of the new National SH&BBV Framework and local BBV Network
