# Health Improvement Flash Report 2022/2023

## Early Years Improvement and Training

Work this year has focussed on the further development of 4 Early Intervention Programmes – The Solihull Approach (SA), Scottish Book Trust (SBT) Book Bug Programme, Public Health Scotland (PHS) Play@home programme and the Scottish Government's Play Talk Read Campaign. (PTR)





#### Play@home (PHS)

2582 attendees

North and South Lanarkshire Education gifted over **3000 books** to families of preschool children this year.

- Face to face multidisciplinary Play@home training recommenced in February 2023.
- August 2022 2582 people attended National Playday at Summerlee where Play@home resources were gifted and highlighted as part of our play sessions. Bookbug also joined us.

### Play Talk Read Campaign(PTR)

Scottish Government, working with Smartplay network were able to recommence their bus tours in 2022. Through working with our Health Improvement Locality Links, we organised venues to visit in 16 different community areas across Lanarkshire.

- In North Lanarkshire , **439 families** attended the local bus tours.
- In South Lanarkshire, **224 families** attended there.
- In August 2022, National Playday had over 400 families visit their sessions at Summerlee.

#### **Bookbug (SBT)**

Both North and South Lanarkshire Bookbug steering groups continue to work in partnership to raise the profile of the free training offered by Scottish Book Trust . In 2022 we had 96 staff members attend Bookbug training to aid their professional development, and support work in communities with families.

The 2022 Lanarkshire Bookbug Shared Practice annual event was able to take place face to face again, with over 80 attendees at Newmains Community Trust. We engaged attendees in a challenged / Solution session to consider what we could change going forwards – here is feedback from a practitioner .... "Challenge is local support for a Bookbug session Solution is buddy/ mentoring, when you go on training find a buddy training too and link up so when you go back to practice you keep in touch and help one another" We asked practitioners to reflect on something they were proud about in their Bookbug learning, here is a comment from one, "I am proud of the new songs and rhymes I have learnt using the Bookbug App and have been able to share with the children and my colleagues, thank you"
