Children require different sensations to develop their sensory systems. Some children may need extra input. Here is variety of suggested toys and materials that provided specific *auditory* input. You can add your own ideas.

	Selection of musical instruments available from www.amazon.co.uk
	Rainmaker - Turn, twist and shake the rainmaker to see and hear the beads cascading through the holes to make a rain sound. Stimulates the auditory sense and helps develop hand eye co- ordination. <u>www.amazon.co.uk</u>
	Music books – Providing a variety of sounds with a story involved. Encourage child to press buttons to make sound with hand over hand assistance. Available from a variety of outlets
	Sound tubes can be colourful and eye catching making a fun 'groaning' when turned or shaken. Can help develop hand eye co-ordination and stimulate auditory senses. Cheery laughing bag – squeeze and you will hear comical bursts of laughter! <u>www.cheapdisablityaid.co.uk</u>
