WHAT DO WE DO?

We are a multidisciplinary health service covering North and South Lanarkshire. We provide specialist health care for people who have a learning disability. The Learning Disability Service is made up of:

- Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS-LD)
- Kylepark Assessment and Treatment Centre
- Community Learning Disability Team

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WHAT IS A LEARNING DISABILITY?

A Learning Disability is a significant, lifelong condition where all of the following three criteria must be met:

- Reduced ability to understand new or complex information or to learn new skills
- Reduced ability to cope independently
- A condition which started before adulthood (before the age of 18) with a lasting effect on the individual's development

YOU CAN BE REFERRED TO THE TEAM IF YOU:

- Have a learning disability
- Are over the age of 16 and have left school or are going through transition from school
- Live or plan to move to the Lanarkshire area
- Have unmet health needs which require a specialist learning disability Service

WE CANNOT PROVIDE A SERVICE IF:

- You do not have a learning disability
- Your health needs can be met by mainstream services
- You have learning difficulties such as dyslexia, ADHD or dyspraxia
- You have an autistic spectrum disorder without a Learning Disability
- You require an assessment only to determine if you have a learning disability or not

YOU COULD BE REFERRED TO THE TEAM IF YOU NEED HELP WITH:

- Mental health issues
- Behavioural changes/concerns
- Management of epilepsy
- Autism
- Forensic issues
- Eating, drinking or dietary concerns
- Communication
- Mobility
- Complex physical health needs
- Support to understand and access health tests
- Health promotion
- Occupational performance issues
- ✤ Grief
- Dementia or suspected dementia

HOW TO ACCESS THE SERVICE



Anyone can make a referral to the Team. For example you can refer yourself, or the referral can be made by a family member, carers, GP, day centre staff or social worker.

WHEN IS THE SERVICE AVAILABLE?

The Team is available Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm, excluding public holidays.



FOLLOWING REFERRAL

If we can offer you support, a Community Learning Disability Nurse or the most appropriate Learning Disability health professional will arrange to meet with you within 28 days to start your assessment for routine referrals or 2 days for urgent referrals.

ATTENDING APPOINTMENTS

It is important that you come to your appointments or are at home for your appointment. If you cannot come to your appointment or will not be home, please telephone to let us know. If you miss an appointment, we will give you another one. If you keep missing appointments, we will look at the reason for this. It might mean we don't give you any more appointments and you might be discharged from the service.

SMOKING

You are not allowed to smoke in any of the NHS Buildings and grounds.
