What to do if your child has an allergic reaction

Symptoms of a mild reaction:

- Swollen lips, face or eyes
- Itchy or tingly mouth
- Hives or itchy rash
- Abdominal cramps or vomiting
- Swollen or itchy eyes
- Runny nose or sneezing

Give Piriton/Cetirizine

> After 10 minutes, if symptoms are no better -

Repeat Piriton/Cetirizine as above and seek advice urgently from your GP (or NHS24 if out of hours)

If condition worsens, see next page.

Symptoms of a severe reaction (anaphylaxis):

- Hoarse voice
- Difficulty swallowing, choking
- Difficult or noisy breathing, wheeze
- Persistent cough
- Dizziness, going pale or floppy, suddenly sleepy
- Collapse, unresponsive [put child into recovery position]

Lie your child down (let them sit if they prefer) + GIVE |EXT + Phone 999

Then try to give **Piriton/Cetirizine** (see left).

If your child is wheezy and has a blue inhaler eg Salbutamol, you can also give 10 puffs using a spacer.

How to give JEXT

- 1. Remove the Jext® from the package
- 2. Remove yellow safety cap
- 3. Hold the lext® as shown, black tip to thigh, press hard until clicks (can be given through clothing).



- 6. Hold in place for 10 seconds, remove and rub thigh firmly
- 7. Keep your child in the recovery position, or sitting if more comfortable
- 8. Phone 999 and Anaphylaxis [AN-A-FEE-LAX-IS].
- 9. If there is no improvement after 5 minutes, give a further lext[®], if available.
- 10. Observation in hospital after anaphylaxis is recommended.
- 11. Ask your GP for replacement Jext®at earliest opportunity.
