What to do if your child has an allergic reaction



The following are symptoms of a **MILD** allergic reaction:

- 1. Swollen lips, face or eyes
- 2. Itchy or tingly mouth
- 3. Hives or itchy rash
- 4. Abdominal cramps or vomiting
- 5. Swollen or itchy eyes.
- 6. Runny nose or sneezing.

If after 10 minutes symptoms are no better, then:


Repeat Piriton/ CETIRIZINE as above

And seek advice from your GP urgently (or NHS 24 if out of hours).

If features of a severe reaction, give Emerade® – see next page.

Symptoms of a **SEVERE** reaction (anaphylaxis):

- 1. Hoarse voice
- 2. Difficulty swallowing, choking
- 3. Difficult or noisy breathing, wheeze
- 4. Persistent cough
- 5. Dizziness, going pale or floppy, suddenly sleepy
- 6. Collapse, unresponsive [put child into recovery position]



Lie your child down (let them sit if they prefer) + Give Emerade®

Try to give Piriton/ Cetirizine (see left). If your child is wheezy and has a blue inhaler, you can also give 10 puffs of Salbutamol using a spacer.

How to Give Emerade®



- Remove needle shield.
- 2. Hold as shown in photo, placing tip at right angle to outer thigh.
- 3. Press hard until you hear a click.
- 4. Hold in place for 5 seconds, remove and rub site vigorously for 10 seconds.
- 5. Keep your child in the recovery position, or sitting if more comfortable.
- 6. Phone **999** for an **AMBULANCE** state Anaphylaxis [AN-A-FEE-LAX-IS]. If there is no improvement after 5 minutes, give a further Emerade, if available.
- 7. Observation in hospital after anaphylaxis is recommended.
- 8. Ask your GP for replacement Emerade at earliest opportunity.

Remember, the best way to prevent reactions is to ask about ingredients, check labels, and tell people you have an allergy.
