Introducing Your Upper Gastrointestinal Nurse Specialist

Your Upper GI Nurse Specialist is an experienced nurse who specialises in the care and support of people with a cancer affecting the stomach, oesophagus (*gullet*) and pancreas. These are organs in the upper part of the gut.

Your Nurse Specialist works throughout Lanarkshire. You will see your Nurse Specialist both at outpatient clinics and in the ward setting. Your Nurse Specialist aims to meet patients and family members from the time of diagnosis, throughout treatment and onto follow-up care.

Your Nurse Specialist works closely with the multiprofessional team; this includes doctors, surgeons, pathologists, radiologists, dieticians etc. This provides a link with other health care professionals, both in the hospital and the community setting in order to provide continuity of care.

What does the Service Provide?

The Upper GI Nurse Specialist is available to any patient and their family/carers with a diagnosis of an upper GI cancer and will:

- Provide information to help you prepare for any investigations, surgery or treatment you may require
- Provide ongoing support, advice and information, and be available to discuss your care and treatment with you
- Provide advice on managing any symptoms you may have as a result of your surgery or treatment
- Provide information about other organisations that may offer you help and support
- Provide advice regarding benefits and other practical issues
- Communicate with others involved in your care
- Provide support for both you and your family

Upper GI cancer can have an effect on your ability to eat and drink. It can cause nutritional problems such as swallowing difficulties, loss of appetite and weight loss.

The dietitian will carry out a nutritional assessment and provide ongoing advice and support to help you manage any issues that may affect you.

How do I contact the service?

If you are in hospital ask your nurse or doctor to contact the Upper GI Nurse Specialist.
