3. IMPACT

All of the above measures are intended to mitigate against the potential impact of more activity coming into the hospital over the winter period and, in turn, supporting earlier assessment of patients, assisting where possible to avoid admissions and, thereafter, to support earlier discharge. To this end, an initial target to increase weekend discharges by 20% has been identified.

Where there is no option but to admit the patient, capacity has been created to accommodate a further 37 surge beds across the 3 hospitals (with scope to increase this by a further 12 if required) and 4 observation beds in the ED in University Hospital Monklands.
